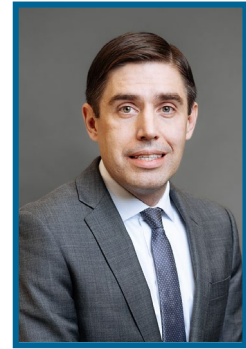


JOHN R. CRONE
