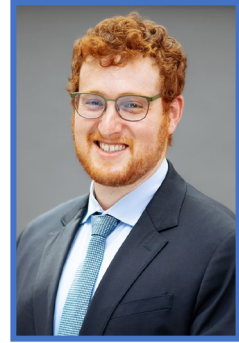


NOAH I. STAR
